### **QUESTIONS AND DISCUSSION**

#### **Traffic Calming – Ormond Road**

Mr Stephenson referred to Minute No. 43 from the previous meeting and requested that the Constituency Engineer be urged to take the necessary action to complete the works as the lights on the three refuges were still not working.

(Mr Carter subsequently reported the following day that the lights were now working)

“Memorial” on the Lamppost Outside 7/11, Holly Hill Road.

Mr Trefor-Jones referred Road Traffic Accident which occurred in November 2008 on Holly Hill Road, in which an 8 year old child was killed. Since the accident a “memorial” consisting of football

shirst and flowers had been placed on the lamp-post outside the 7/11 close to the accident site. Mr Trefor-Jones acknowledged that the “memorial” had been refreshed on the anniversary of the accident but, in his opinion, the “memorial” was now an eyesore which should be removed. He requested therefore that the City Council be most strongly requested to take the necessary action to remove the “memorial”. Mr Grey suggested that it could be posposed to the parents that a permanent memorial, such a small flower garden around the base of the lamppost, be placed in the place of the current mermorial

#### Model Car Club

Mr Trefor-Jones statedt that he would like to see the Parish Council developing links with the Club involving the local youth. Ian pointed out that the club had been vandalised. Mr Tefor-Jones offered to give some funding from Neighbourhood Watch
