CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT AND FUTURE PLANS

The Chairperson submitted a written report which was circulated to people attending the meeting.

He mentioned the lack of progress on flood prevention measures and the major problems with the Frankley Centre development because of the attitudes of the Planning Department. He was concerned at the proposed closure of the Tudor Rose Centre which he thought showed the Social Services Department taking the easy option.

Mr. Stephenson asked about the current situation with the Frankley Centre development. The Clerk explained that he was unhappy with the situation and was trying to arrange a meeting with the Deputy City Planning Officer to discuss the current situation. The Chairperson commented on the difference between planning attitudes to the Great Park site and to Frankley. He felt there was a need to look again at the Longbridge ward plan.

Mr. Stephenson asked if the Parish Council still supported the extension of the railway line to Frankley. The Chairperson said that this remained Council policy and that a further report was expected to be published by the City Council in June.

There being no further questions the Chairperson declared the meeting closed at 1920 hours.
