FRANKLEY CENTRE DEVELOPMENT

- 113 The Chairperson reported on the progress of the Development. A Consultant, Mike Olley, had been engaged to draw up plans for the Centre with the vacant sites being allocated to Retail use. He added that City Councillor Sir Albert Bore would be launching the Development at the beginning of April. Additionally, there was a suggestion to persuade the City Council to invest the money that it had received for the sale of the land into building a Police Station adjacent to the Development. This building could also house the monitors for the CCTV system which was proposed for the Centre although the CCTV pictures would be monitored by a private security firm rather than the Police.

With regard to the proposal that the remainder of the Development be allocated to Retail use, the Chairperson advised Members that the Parish Council, in conjunction with the Developer, Arden Park Properties, were currently undertaking a survey of residents of the Estate to ascertain what sort of retail outlet the public would prefer on the Development.
