MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD ON 23RD MAY 2016

RIGHT OF WAY ACROSS SCHOOL PLAYING FIELD

- 74 Mr Grey reported that the above matter was still outstanding. The Clerk suggested that he would write to the City Council's Footpath Officer to establish the level of progress together with a copy of the letter to the Head Teacher.

UNUSED TURBINES AND COLUMNS

- 75 Mr Grey advised that the situation was unchanged from the last meeting of the Assembly, adding that the item should remain on the agenda, and should the planning conditions no longer apply, the Parish Council would need confirmation in writing.

The Clerk stated that he would write to the Planning Department at the City Council to establish the current position.

LONGBRIDGE CENTRE DEVELOPMENT

76 Mr Keating expressed concern that there was a continual lack of investment regarding industrial development on the Longbridge site. The lack of provision for light industry was a problem as it would impact on wealth creation for the area.

The Chairperson advised there were rumours that Jaguar were considering the site for electric vehicle construction, adding that MG operation had only retained its development and sales centre at Longbridge, having relocated their assembly function elsewhere.

Finally, Mr Keating stated that another proposal involved the University of Birmingham relocating their Science Hub to Longbridge, however there has been no additional information regarding the issue.
